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

Cyber Safety: K-12 & Parents

The cyber safety program has age-appropriate versions available for K-6, 7th grade and up, as well as for parents. K-6 students will receive an introduction to cyber predators, social media safety, and the consequences of cyber-bullying. 7th -12th grade students may also receive information on the dangers of distracted driving, sexting and the importance of protecting your privacy.



Anti-Bullying: Grades 4-12 & Parents

Addresses the different types of bullying, how it's affecting our youth, and preventative measures students & parents can take. We provide real-life examples of children and young adults who have been involved in bullying and discuss the role of the bully and bystander.



Human Trafficking: Grades 7-12 & Parents

Human trafficking happens in **every community in Arizona**. In this presentation we discuss the crime of human trafficking, how traffickers find their victims and steps teens can take to protect themselves. We also provide real-life examples of human trafficking in Arizona and explain what you should do if you suspect someone may be a victim of human trafficking.
