

October Shred-A-Thon Recap



In a continued effort to prevent identity theft across the state, the Office of Arizona Attorney General, Mark Brnovich hosted a shred-a-thon on October 28th, 2017 in partnership with the Arizona Department of Revenue and ASDD Document Destruction. Within four hours, over 8 tons of sensitive documents were destroyed, equal to 136 trees and 24 cubic yards of landfill space.

Stear Clear of Grinches this Holiday Season

The holiday season is a wonderful time to help those in need. While you may choose to donate to a charity this holiday season and spread your holiday cheer, scammers are looking to take advantage of your generosity.

Below are a few tips to consider before giving to a charity for this and every season.

Never give on impulse and do your research before you donate. Many websites are available that rate charities based on how well they use donated funds. Get started with www.charitywatch.org or www.charitynavigator.org.

Be wary of telemarketers claiming to act on behalf of a charity. If high-pressure tactics are used or a telemarketer refuses to provide information about the organization or how the donation will be used, these could be signs of a charity scam.

Avoid making donations in cash or via wire transfer. Contribute by check that is payable to the fund, not to an individual, and mail directly to the charity.

Confirm that your contribution is tax deductible. If they can't provide proof that your donation is tax-deductible, it may be a scam.
