A Trial has been scheduled in the above-referenced case. It is set to begin on February 2, 2005 at 9:30 a.m. before the Honorable Gregory H. Martin, Maricopa County Superior Court, Central Court Building (CCB), 11th Floor, 201 West Jefferson, Phoenix, AZ, 85003.

You are not required to attend this Trial, unless you receive a subpoena. However, you have the lawful right to be present. If you are planning to attend, please be advised it is common for court proceedings to be delayed or rescheduled for various reasons. If you plan to attend, you may want to call the BFA Help Line at (602) 364-1275 in advance to verify that the Trial has not been continued.

If your testimony is necessary at the Trial, you will be subpoenaed by the Assistant Attorney General. A subpoena is a court order which requires you to be available to testify from the time and date on your subpoena, until such time as you are specifically excused.

Prior to the Trial, a Status Conference is scheduled for July 9, 2004 at 9:00 a.m. before the Honorable Gregory H. Martin in the same courtroom as referenced above. Various motions will be addressed during this Pre-Trial phase at the Status Conference.

It is possible that plea negotiations may begin at any time before the Trial date. If this happens, we will notify you of the plea negotiations and of the rights you are entitled to regarding plea negotiations.
